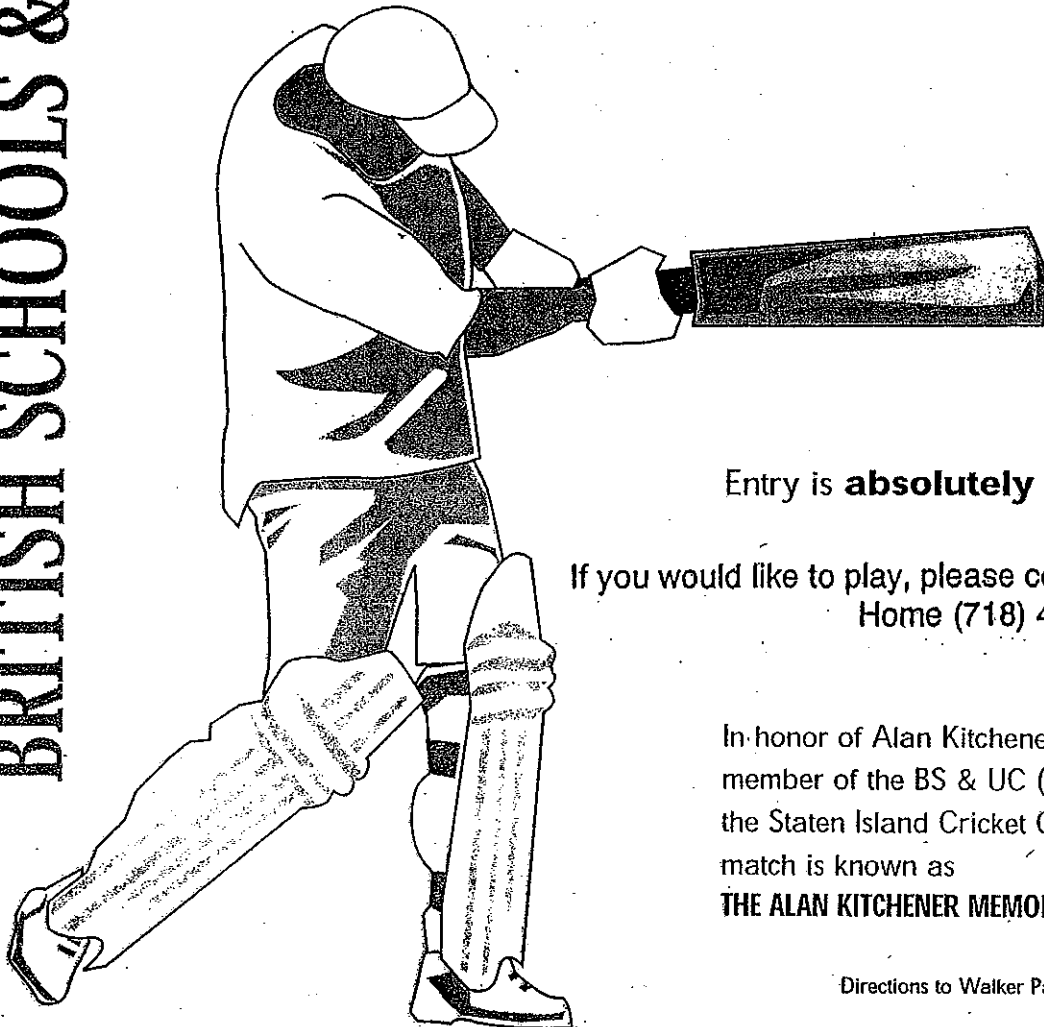
It's just not **Cricket!**

DIRECTIONS TO WALKER PARK, STATEN ISLAND

BY CAR FROM BROOKLYN

Cross the Verrazano Bridge.
Go west on the Staten Island Expressway.
Exit at Clove Road/Richmond Avenue.
Drive straight ahead to the top of the hill.
Make a right at Clove Road.
Drive along Clove Road to Bard Avenue
(immediately before cemetery).
Make a sharp right onto Bard Avenue.
Follow Bard Avenue to the park (one block from the river).

BY CAR FROM MANHATTAN

The best way is via Brooklyn; follow directions from there.

BY CAR FROM NEW JERSEY

Cross the Goethals Bridge.
Go east on the Staten Island Expressway to Slosson Avenue exit.
Turn left at the bottom of the ramp.
Cross Victory Boulevard.
Continue downhill to Martling Avenue and turn right.
Drive to Clove Road and make a right turn.
At the second traffic signal, turn left onto Bard Avenue.
Follow Bard Avenue to the park (one block from the river).

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FROM MANHATTAN

Take the 1 or 9 Subway (the front cars) to South Ferry.
Take the Staten Island Ferry to St. George. (Ferries leave every half hour.)
Take the #40 bus on Richmond Terrace and
ask the driver to let you off at Bard Avenue.
Walk one block away from the water to Walker Park.
